- 2 次の対話の文章を読んで、後の各問に答えよ。
(*印の付いている単語・語句には、本文の後に〔注〕がある。)

Ella is an exchange student from Sweden. She stays with Sora and Riku's family in Japan. Sora and Riku are high school students. During this summer, Ella visited Niigata. Sora and Riku's grandmother lives there. After their trip to Niigata, they decided to visit Sweden. Now they are on an airplane to Sweden.

Riku: So, how was your trip to Niigata?

Ella: It was really fun! Japan has many local dishes, and each of them is very interesting. Your grandmother, Yoko, likes the local dish in Niigata... what was it?

Sora: (1)Italian?

Ella: That's right! When I heard the name, I thought it was spaghetti. But when I saw the real dish, I was so surprised.

Sora: Yes. It looks like spaghetti with meat sauce, but the noodles are fried noodles, not spaghetti. And the meat sauce has a lot of corn in it. Grandma Yoko really loves *Italian*.

Riku: I love *Italian* too! When I visit Niigata, I always eat it.

Ella: Does your mother, Chika, also like *Italian*?

Sora: Ah, Mom says that she prefers not to eat *Italian*.

Ella: I see. Everyone has their own *taste. By the way, (2)the Japanese special decorations during Obon were also nice.

Sora: Do you mean the cucumber horse and the *eggplant cow?

Ella: Yes, they were so cute! That is a unique part of Japanese culture. We don't have that in Sweden. Japanese people use those decorations to welcome the spirits of their ancestors, right?

Riku: Exactly. We traditionally decorate cucumbers as horses and eggplants as cows. We believe that if our ancestors' spirits ride the cucumber horses, they can come to us quickly. We also believe that if they ride the eggplant cows when they leave, they will go back to heaven slowly.

Sora: When I first learned about this as a child, I thought it was really interesting. Was there anything else you liked about Niigata?

Ella: Yes. I also enjoyed the plum juice your Grandma Yoko made. It was so delicious!

Riku: I like Grandma Yoko's plum juice ..., but I like apple juice the best!

Sora: Every summer, Grandma Yoko makes plum juice. She taught us how to make it, so now we can make the juice too.

Ella: How lovely! We also have a similar tradition in Sweden. People make *syrup from elderflowers in summer. The flowers are in full bloom in July. People can pick them freely, and then make syrup at home. You may be surprised to know that the syrup is good for *sore throats and colds. Swedish people love it.

Riku: (3)I didn't know that. Can I try that syrup when I visit your home?

Ella: Of course! I hope you'll like it.

Sora: You also have (4)fika in Sweden, right? I heard it's like a coffee break.

Ella: You know a lot. Many people take a 15-minute break twice a day, around 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to enjoy coffee and sweets. Many companies have *fika* time so that people can work better. My brother, Lucas, says, "When we have coffee and sweets, we can relax and talk with people who we don't usually talk to. *Fika* plays an important role in helping us to get along well with people."

Riku: Talking about *fika* makes me hungry. When can we get in-flight meals?

Ella: My airplane ticket says we left at 18:00. It also says dinner will be served one hour after the plane takes off. Now it's 18:55, so soon!

Sora: But our plane actually left 30 minutes late because of the strong wind. I think dinner will be served at 19:30.

Riku: Oh, that's right. In-flight meals are also one of the fun parts of a trip! I hope I can drink my favorite juice.

Sora: Ella, I'm worried about your in-flight meal because you have some *allergies.

Ella: Don't worry. I ordered a special meal before getting on the plane. There are in-flight meals that people with allergies can eat, so I can feel safe.

Sora: (5)I'm glad to hear that.

Riku: There are meals for people who cannot eat some foods because of *religious or cultural reasons. *Halal food can be found in Japan now.

Sora: Exactly. Meals made with soy meat are popular, too. At some burger shops in Japan, we can change the beef *patty to a soy patty. Mom often does that.

Ella: I heard *methane gas from *livestock can be a cause of global warming, so some people avoid eating meat to protect the environment.

Riku: I understand why they avoid eating meat for the environment. Global warming is a serious problem today. But I love BBQ and *sukiyaki*, so I have mixed feelings about it.

Sora: I think global warming is dramatically changing our way of life. If the temperature gets much higher, the types of fruit and vegetables we can grow will change. We might not be able to enjoy various Japanese dishes anymore. That would be sad.

Riku: I want to protect Japanese food culture while I'm caring about the environment.

Ella: That's true. Oh, here comes the meal!
